### **Storms and Floods**



Our emergency workers struggled to cope with the widespread deluges. Huge thanks to so many people who rolled up their sleeves, shifting trees, managing sand bags and redirecting floodwaters. Thank you also for the ongoing work with me to make sure the drains are clear, reporting them on **www.fixmystreet.com** and texting or e-mailing me so I can speak to the officers and make sure their significance is properly understood and action taken. Even in the emergency periods, the fixmystreet website was used as the primary allocation of Council Highways staff. The County Council is the lead Flood Authority and have the task of co-ordinating with all the other bodies.



## **NK Plan and Budget**

I was pleased to support the business plan and budget at NKDC this year, crafted from an extensive and inclusive process to support local people, places and our environment. Passed unanimously by Council for the first time in years!

Especially pleased to see funds ear-marked for investment in health and wellbeing, including mental health and for reducing our impact on the environment and climate change. A £220m ten-year investment strategy includes improving facilities and our future income with the business park, cinema and the town centre. I am optimistic for high quality services here in housing, leisure, waste management, environmental services, economic development and hopefully, good planning.

Government support was relatively good in this election year but there are known reductions and uncertainties ahead, particularly in whether we get to keep your business rates for local spend and in the proposed fairer distribution of funds across the country.

Hence the District Council tax is rising by £4.95 per year per household. County Council tax makes up the biggest portion of the bill and is rising by 3.5%.

## **Lincolnshire County Council**

The County Council budget includes care for adults and children, which needs proper long-term funding. I'm working on that at the LGA. The £490m this year is not expecting any noticeable cuts. Savings have been made from new and better care contracts. Pay-outs for

damaged cars has been higher than expected, and still more is needed and included for Highways this year.

Covenant Grant Scheme is to help local projects that aim to strengthen the ties between members of the armed forces community and the wider community in which they live. The Covenant Fund has £10 million each year to support the Armed Forces Covenant by funding projects which address specific priorities. ## Supporting you on Planning

Three contentious applications

**The Rendering Plant** at Norton Disney was heard at the Bentley on Feb 3<sup>rd</sup>, with a recommendation from North Kesteven District Council that it be refused. Councillors had previously viewed the site at first hand. The applicant made his case and local resident and Parish Council Chairman gave powerful speeches. As local member, I opened the debate. The application was refused unanimously, on the grounds of industrial development in the open countryside, damaging the setting of an important heritage site, that was unjustified and unnecessary.

### **Crematorium at Norton Disney**

The new crematorium in the open countryside was refused by us at NKDC and went to appeal under an external Inspector. ClIrs Mary Green and Chris Spray attended the whole of the long day hearing in the NKDC Council offices and were able to usefully contribute. The Council team and the applicant team were both five

strong. We await to hear the outcome.

## Transport Plan – your view?

The new Lincoln Transport Strategy 2020-2036 is out. The priority to support planned economic growth does little to assist maintenance of the current network. Instead it seems to focus on transport as a means to increase building projects and is very light on public transport, cyclepaths and walking routes. It focusses on the Southern bypass of Lincoln, now called the "Hykeham Relief Road", accompanied by much future housing. The catchy title of "eco-hub" at Bracebridge Heath is a bus interchange, but hard to spot how it will be better. Congestion is expected to increase to a six-minute wait at junctions.

## **Boundary Changes**

The ward boundaries are important as they link villages that naturally work well together. The government wants to change the boundaries so that we all represent the same number of electors. Currently the Cliff Villages is pretty well on the button, and should stay together, but neighbouring areas may create a damaging knock-on effect. We also called for better **emergency health** services at Grantham day and night. The knock -on effect of closing Grantham at night, has resulted in long waiting times at an over-stretched Lincoln hospital. We deserve better.
