High Flight by John Magee Jr



Wellingore Parish Council is chaired by author Roger Coles and includes District **Councillor Catherine** Mills. Together with volunteers from Wellingore, Navenby, the RAF and Lincolnshire Aviation Heritage, good progress is being made on the planned memorial to the pilot and poet John Gillespie Magee Jr. to be placed in the Millfield Park, along

Lancaster Bomber Memorial Permission Granted

Permission was granted on 24th April for a full sized replica Lancaster Bomber on the A46 at Norton Disney to form the gateway to Lincolnshire. Higher than the Angel of the North, wider with a 31m wingspan and heavier than a real



Lancaster, being built of durable steel, not light aluminium. It is a fitting commemoration of 100 years of the RAF and the contributions made by people of Lincolnshire and Nottinghamshire. The artistic tribute (without the poppies) reflects Lincolnshire's long-standing contribution to engineering, agriculture and aerial defence. Almost a third of the £100,000 needed has already been raised. The application came with a huge list of supporters and an excellent speakers.

Celebrating the Armed Forces

The Lincolnshire Independents have raised this as a big year to celebrate the Armed forces, with the opening of the International Bomber Command Centre and to mark 100 years since armistice day and 100 years of the RAF. NHS GP facilities not coming to Witham St Hughs

The application for 1250 new dwellings at Witham St Hughs went through planning last week. A high-powered representative of the NHS was there. The NHS five-year plan of March 2017 is to "Strengthen access to high quality GP services and primary care, which are far and away the largest point of interaction that patients have with the NHS each year."

I made the case for residents in Witham St Hughs, with a high proportion of young families. I asked for a local facility like Navenby where doctors move between surgeries, making it easier for patients. The CCG speaker replied that buildings cost money and they would rather spend the money on services. They have, however, built at North Hykeham and the money is now allocated to build at Bassingham too.

Centralising services may be easier for the NHS but can be very difficult for residents. I also called on the District Council to ring-fence funding for Witham St Hughs.

I believe this is an opportunity missed. I proposed a more imaginative solution, led by the District Council using the £500k promised by developers as a base. This demonstrates to me how we are asked to take large amounts of housing without providing the matching services or facilities.

Listening to you

How many new houses for Leadenham?

Many of you kindly responded when I was consulting on the Local Plan for Central Lincolnshire, which identifies how much and where new housing would be acceptable. I objected to the total increase of 37,900 new dwellings, which comes with a significant unfunded shortfall in facilities. As you will have noticed, our public services are already severely struggling, including roads, NHS hospital and GP's, police and ambulance services.

To enable some growth but without swamping local services and to keep the village character, small villages like Leadenham were allocated 10-15% growth between 2012 and 2036. 15% for Leadenham was in line with your comments to me and I supported this on your behalf at the public Inquiry. That would mean a further 20 dwellings in total over the 25 years, either new or from conversion of houses into flats. The plan also requires an incremental growth of "about 4 dwellings" in each application and the use of infill or brownfield sites first.

Heyford Developments, however, are asking for 36 houses on the green paddock on the A607 in front of the small industrial site. If all the housing comes at once on one greenfield site, then there is no allowance for anyone else, however small. On the plus side, over ten dwellings means a small contribution to our communities should be due and a larger contribution towards the Lincoln Eastern Bypass. The risk is that this is not always forthcoming, as we have seen elsewhere. Once permission is obtained, the land can be sold, and plans changed, so now is the time to carefully consider what you think is right.

Likewise, NKDC seeks 25% of houses to be "Affordable", but we often do not get it in the end. For the record, "government affordable" means 85% of market value.

Housing over and above the allocation can only get permission with community support.

The developer's consultation is on May 24th in the Village Hall. These are often run by professional public relations people who do a smooth job and keep your comments to make their case. Please let Catherine Mills and me who sit on the planning committee, know your views so that we can properly represent you, and keep to the rules.

When the developer is ready, they will submit the application to the District Council who will collect your comments directly via the planning on line website. http://planningonline.n-kesteven.gov.uk/online-applications
