## **LEADENHAM PARISH COUNCIL ANNUAL REPORT 2015-16**

At last year's Parish Council elections, we received three new councillors.

We have completed 2 parish walks, with the aim to inspect closely all areas and note items that need attention - drains, street lighting, dog waste bins, grass verges, overhanging growth and potholes: bearing in mind that we only have limited powers to demand any necessary changes or improvements.

Throughout the year we have undertaken the following main projects.

Repair and cleaning of the War Memorial.. Councillor Mr.O'Brien took on the responsibility for this:- applying for grants ,liaising with Diocese and obtaining estimates for necessary work . As with all grant aided work , it takes much time and of course , full amounts required are never offered , so the PC have budgeted for this in this year's precept.

Leadenham Village Fountain is also in dire need of repair, so Councillor Mrs Stokes has accepted responsibility for this . Once again , a lengthy and complicated route necessary to establish permission and funding. Mrs Stokes is also involving our Primary School and has given a talk to all children with emphasis on the history and initial need for this very special facility and now, monument .

Following many complaints of excessive speeding through our village, Councillor Mr.McLusky has been liaising with the Road Safety Partnership to receive and purchase more higher visibility signage and their placements.

The much needed and long-awaited repairs to our Play Area have been assessed and work ordered ; once again budgeted for in this year's precept.

That old Chestnut - Highway Matters.

During a recent meeting with our Highways Officer, Mr.Steve Welsh, we received the dismal news, that parishioners can no longer receive the high level of support from LCC Highways Dept. Financial constraints mean that it is now a case of - what they can't do for us as opposed to what they can.

Replacement of road signs is not automatic, with priority given to 'stop and give way ' signs : road signs are no longer cleaned or cleared of vegetation.

As we know, potholes continue to be a big problem but now, once again, go on a list for when a team are in the area-major roads only.

There has been much discussion with Leadenham Bowls Club concerning ownership and running costs. We are now in process of drawing up a Contract, not only to protect the Club, but also the Parish, in the future.

Councillor Mr McLusky has taken on responsibility for reviving our Parish website, which has now been up and running for a several months. Contact details are in the Parish Magazine, 2 Villages. It is hoped that this will be up dated and added to , in future , to include all club s, amenities and their news.

A Dog Warden was employed by the PC last year, at a cost of £740 and improvements resulted. However, we intend to purchase 2 more dog waste bins this year and hope that this improvement continues without his services.

The verge clearance from Quarry Lane along the east side of A607 to opposite Troops, at a cost of  $\pounds 1008$ . This was badly overgrown and obscuring vision for road users at the junction. This will now be cut regularly to avoid further rogue growth .

Great attempts were made, alongside our district and county councillors and neighbouring villages, to maintain the use of quarry Lane Waste Disposal Tip; attending many meetings with all and sundry. Sadly, all arguments against closure fell on deaf ears. Attempts, with suggestions continue, to date.

We await further information with regard to the Application for the erection of Wind Farm , on the site of the old Fulbeck Airfield . Council put forward , objections on your behalf , following the poll we carried out. This is due for July .

Council continue to forcefully correspond with LCC Highways concerning the safety issues surrounding the walkway for children, to William Robertson School. Despite highlighting the urgent need for construction of a Safety Path , we are informed that monies that had been ring fenced for this , have now been required elsewhere. We will not give up though .
