Better Mental Health

We have consistently called for better support for increasing mental health, as early support makes all the difference. The County Council and the NHS have improved services both online and talking to a real person. Especially in lockdown, it is important to keep in touch by phone and there is some simple help on wellbeing here.

Supporting our Neighbours

Our area has a dozen neighbourhood support groups, evolving from an emergency response to the covid pandemic to a long-term support network. We are meeting fortnightly online with the Consultant for Public Health. In February, the Rev. Michelle Godbold highlighted the excellent work of the Graffoe Group. Certificates of thanks are on their way to brilliant volunteers who have made such a difference. Thank you. Want to take part? Please let me know. This week, we are applying for a grant to do more for our communities.

Saving the Planet continues...



If you have been watching David Attenborough lately, you will have seen the importance of tackling climate change, supporting our biodiversity and keeping a clean environment. The Lincolnshire Independents proposed a motion to change the way the council works to do just that. The whole Council has been working on the Climate Emergency Strategy and Action Plan which is on the NKDC website here. It plans to reach net zero emissions by 2030. We are also looking at the way in which the regional planning works so that the decisions that the Council makes are also contributing to the target of net zero emissions.

I find it hard to see how we can continue to build at a rate far greater than is wanted by local people, without increasing traffic and further draining the earth's resources and reducing air quality.

A Planning First

Two houses were refused at the edge of Carlton Le Moorland because it would extend the built features of the village and for the first time on biodiversity grounds. The site had been mapped as of ecological importance. On policy 21, the biodiversity was not enhanced by the development – a first for us. 20/0020/OUT Appeal decision

Another landmark case this month in Swaton, pitted the conservation officer protecting green space near a church against a convincing eco-house. At the end of an online meeting lasting over four hours, it was passed. Feb 2nd 20/1227/FUL Use "Planning on line North Kesteven".

Rendering Plant in Skellingthorpe

At planning on Monday, the application is recommended for approval with a vehicle routing agreement and other conditions to protect residents. 20/0550/CCC at County.

Sweeping changes to planning - from Whitehall



Recent very unpopular proposals have been put on hold until after the elections, but they were <u>published</u> in January 2021. The commitment remains to build houses at a faster rate than ever. This has little regard for what people can afford, nor what services can be provided. Only the house-builders have welcomed what others see as "shameful", and a "disaster" and a "naked ideological assault on local democracy".

Fundamentally, the proposal takes the planning largely out of local influence. Central government makes the policies and a tick box exercise done by the developers gives them their permissions. Local Councils are then largely reduced to looking at design to make them "beautiful". This is especially worrying, when we have seen the same Secretary of State over-ride local decision-making process to give planning permission on the Isle of Dogs to a party donor, permission that was subsequently withdrawn.

If we want to improve planning, we need to increase influence from local people, not reduce it.

The new National Policy Framework is out for <u>consultation</u> until 27th March. Let me know what you think.

Green Masterplan for Lincolnshire

The County and District Councils have brought out a "Green masterplan" to help tackle Climate change, meeting zero carbon by 2050. Getting buildings more energy efficient, flexible working, separate collection of paper and card recyclables, reusing road materials, planting on a former waste site and along the new bypass.

Colleagues and I have worked hard on the North Kesteven's strategy and <u>action plan</u> is worth a look.

Lincoln City has a problem with air quality and I have offered to support their climate action commission, bringing experience from my European expert group where I am a spokesperson on Environmental issues.

Tackling Flooding

We have a drainage infrastructure that is still Roman in some places and an increase in extreme events. The planning policy encourages rapid "growth" to bring many more people into the area. Brant Broughton, Leadenham and Welbourn have suffered greatly, despite our best efforts. I have pushed for better protection with some positive response. A further £2.2m is hopefully to be allocated in the new budget.

Better Rural Roads

You will have heard me constantly hammering away to get improvements in the state of our rural roads. Thank you for your help with reporting immediate repairs and thank you to Parish Councils for their support in pushing for significant resurfacing where it is desperately needed.

We have had some success and more on the way. Nationally, I and colleagues have raised the matter with ministers and in the County Council. I am pleased to see a further £10m is now proposed for our rural roads. I had a good meeting with highways recently highlighting the issues and holding them to account on how they prioritise works. It is clear that our unclassified roads are in a very poor state and need better funding, which I hope is on the way. We also made good use of the small response team in our communities a few months back.



Supporting local businesses and jobs

To keep our local businesses afloat, North Kesteven has distributed £26.37m in over 4,000 individual payments, which runs out at the Feb half term. Most was for businesses registered for rates, then a further £1m discretionary grants for the 127 businesses who could show they were impacted by covid restrictions. 48 pubs with mainly beer sales received a one-off £1000 each.

New Grants for Business

A "severe impact grant" of around half a million pounds is being distributed now. If you think you may be eligible, have a look at the BusinessNK page, and please ask via the site. When is state aid a good thing?

Minister Kwasi Kwarteng MP set out a new system of subsidies for UK businesses, as the EU State Aid rules are lifted. The new principles allow the four governments of the UK to use public funds for companies to support "UK policy objectives, levelling up economic growth in the regions, tackling climate change and supporting our economic recovery". It cannot, however, be used to enable unfair competition between countries, nor bail out unsustainable companies, we hear. That sounds to me like a very fine line. The 8-week consultation to March 31st is here. The rules under which councils can give subsidies are here. Should party donations be declared, for example? Let me know what you think.

Investors in People

North Kesteven District Council has achieved the Investors in People Gold Standard. Staff feel there is a good balance between providing support and guidance and empowering and trusting them to get on with the job. They love the health and wellbeing provision and support available to them. Areas for further improvement include embedding the corporate values into all areas, particularly decision-making.

Returning to School

In my national meetings, we have been discussing ways for the councils and NHS to work together, priorities for the next wave of vaccinations and getting children back to school safely. Colleagues and I have also called for the additional support needed to enable children to catch up academically, physically and emotionally as they aim to start returning to school from March 8th.

Providing activities for children

Like other out of school clubs, our Wildlife Watch Group also met inventively online to make bird feeders and start the Big Garden Birdwatch on the last weekend in January. We have also made a video, an <u>Introduction to Fungi</u>, now on you-tube. For anyone running clubs for children of key workers, guidance is online <u>here</u>.

Poetry and art

The Love Lincs Plants Team are running a Haiku poem competition that children and young people can enter before the end of June 2021. Vaccinations

Captain Sir Tom was a great inspiration, but sadly couldn't have the vaccine himself. Our hearts go out to all who have gut-wrenching losses at this time.



In Lincolnshire, vaccinations have been flying out the door at some NHS surgeries including Waddington, the Mere Leisure Centre in Grantham, Lincolnshire Showground, Gainsborough, Boston and care homes. Lincolnshire is on target for getting the top vulnerability groups vaccinated by mid February. Today we have 90% of over 75's vaccinated, 60% of the 70-74 year old cohort and all eligible residents in care homes aged over 65.

The next programme will focus on the next priority groups, whilst also then starting to deliver the second vaccination to people at the 12 week mark.
