LOCAL PRIORITY

Every three months, we listen to your concerns and look at recent crime statistics to shape the things we will concentrate on for the next three months. Our priority(s) for the next quarter is:

Patrols re Anti Social Behaviour at Washingborough Community Centre Car Park/Playing field.

There has been one report of antisocial behaviour at the Community Centre within the last month. This report related to 8 young people gathering at the centre, breaching COVID guidelines.

We would ask the community to continue to support us by reporting any antisocial behaviour in progress Tel: 101.

We continue to patrol the key hotspot areas for antisocial behaviour.

WHAT'S BEEN HAPPENING

Two males arrested following criminal damage – Cliff Villages

Two males have been arrested and are currently under investigation and on bail conditions following 54 offences committed along the A607 corridor between Lincoln and Caythorpe. There have been multiple victims reporting incidents to the police which have included assault, harassment, damage to properties & vehicles and multiple incidents of eggs being thrown.

COVID 19 breaches

This weekend (27th & 28th Feb) has seen widespread gatherings of youths in all public spaces in our towns and villages, notably North Hykeham, Branston and Washingborough. These groups have not amounted to COVID 19 compliant incidents of exercise or gatherings in bubbles. They have been large gatherings of youths who are not socially distancing and are in some cases engaging in disorder. These incidents have extended late into the evenings. Parents can be fined a £200 Fixed Penalty Ticket (fine doubles on each occasion) if their teenagers are found to be breaching COVID 19 Regulations. This is not a line Police readily wish to
