Some Highways facts

48 staff order 60-70,000 minor works every year. 1,651 reports are currently outstanding, 600-700/week, which is about as low as it has ever been. Change of Parliamentary Boundary

The boundaries of the Parliamentary Constituency for Sleaford and North Hykeham are moving. North Kesteven has had more new housing than its neighbours, taking the constituency up to about 95,000 people. The proposal is to move Heckington Rural and Osbournby Wards into the Grantham, leaving about 73,000 people in Sleaford and North Hykeham, closer to the average. NKDC Wards in Lincoln remain, that is Waddington East, Skellingthorpe and Bracebridge Heath. East Midlands will have one more MP, 47 out of the 650 UK wide. www.bcereviews.org.uk

Farming leads the way on Carbon Capture and Wildlife recovery



Cereals 2021 is now the major UK showplace for arable farming and is being held currently at Boothby Graffoe over two days. All the focus in farming is now on changing systems to prevent the continual degradation of soils and create a sustainable low carbon farming system for the future. It seems no-one in the farming world is talking about anything else.

Farming is the biggest contributor to greenhouse gases and is clearly determined to beat the inadequate government target of zero carbon well before 2050 and even export our knowledge and commitment around the world. While government is still indecisive over many aspects of the new changes, they have announced a system of farm payments that directly rewards improvement of soils. What does this mean? It means active measures to increase organic content resulting in better yields. This will also lead to a benefit to biodiversity that relies on complete soil organism balance to feed the hierarchy of wildlife that relies on it, right up to the birds that have declined over recent decades.

Ironically a lone Skylark sang over the showground, probably unimpressed with the sudden invasion of thousands of people from all over the country. However, maybe its future is just a little more secure, now there is a real determination to get rid of many chemicals, which are a heavy expense to the farmer and are increasingly unreliable for crop protection.



George Eustace MP, Minister for Agriculture answered my question on certainty of long term funding for Environmental benefits in farming, with optimism

Local Wildlife



For those of you who have followed the success of our kestrels, you will be pleased to know that this year has seen a record five young fledged from the box in front of Hilltop Barn. They left on 28th June to try their luck in the open country. They have been driving their parents mad and now learning to find thrir own food. We have a rewilding field adjacent to the Kestrel box, which must have increased the food source. Parents have also been trying to see off the much larger and agile Kite encouraging it off the cliff edge - quite a sight!

The rain has been tough on keeping public spaces mown, but great for insects and voles, with local barn owls also having more success than for the past five years with many nest sites occupied around Lincolnshire - the top county for owls and much more besides

Waste

Litter Thank you to well organised volunteers who do a great job. Fines of £75 are made if evidence is submitted. Dead anilmals on the road are also collected by NKDC, so please report them on fixmystreet.com.

Fly Tipping 491 recently, 48% up on last year, 1607 pa NKDC will investigate on public or private land, (Andrew Beaver). They have five camouflaged cameras, and a standard £400 for fly-tipping, plus costs, up to £1000 and seizing of vehicles. We all have a duty of care in who we pay to take our waste away. There were three large loads in Leadenham, and material at Norton Disney cost several thousand pounds to remove. NKDC will take up to three large items away for just £30. Ring 01529 414155

Dog fouling Parishes can employ environment wardens supported by NKDC. They can send a community warning notice and £100 fixed penalty. We have well over a thousand litter.bins, emptied weekly, creating £97 tons that go to the energy from waste plant!

National Changes

The Government is taking back control, not just from Europe, but also from Councils. Consultation is out on centralising the decisions around how to collect waste. from Councils, the decision-making around collection of waste. https://consult.defra.gov.uk/waste-and-recycling

Childrens Services

Lincolnshire County Council is responsible for over 192,000 children and in this the County Council is recognised as "outstanding". Sadly the covid lockdowns have resulted in an increase in childrens' needs, with 674 children now in our care and 17,000 getting extra care, placed with another family member, foster carer or residential care. 500 new places are being created in special schools and local schools are adapted wherever possible. Rural School transport is huge, at £29m/yr to transport 17,500 children a day.

The Children's Services department is strengthening intensive work to assist schools so all children catch up, reduce needs required, increase foster care and early help. A third of the Council's staff and £122m, plus dedicated schools funds of £646m. Led by Director, Heather Sandy. 01522 782111

The Council is reviewing mental health provision including CAMHS commissioned by the Council, which is performing well. Parental support is available. We have a good service for early worries, just search on "Healthy Minds".

Schools

Covid in schools is stable and not a high risk. Over a hundred schools had covid cases, but now down to 22, only a handful where it appears to have spread within school. 50,000 tests done every week and less that 0.1% positive. (However, cases are up a bit now)
Director Martin Smith gave an update on schools
Attendance in Lincolnshire is good at over 88%, and 374 returining from home education. Extra Government funding for children catching up and for teachers has come in, but is much less than planned - Only £1.4bn of the required £15bn which for Lincolnshire gives us £22 per pupil. We made the case clearly, but this does not cover the cost of providing what the government says is needed.

Children's Centres

Midwifery and health worker support have continued through the lockdown, and much more is planned. Closest are Caythorpe 01400 279285 and Witham St Hughs Academy 01522 869541. Early years alliance were funded to provide support online.

Carers

Lincolnshire County Council care for over 10,000 carers, almost 8,000 older people, almost a thousand people with mental health needs and around 3,500 adults with a learning or physical disability.

£1/3m is spent on disabled facilities grant in North Kesteven so people can stay in their own home. £46m is spent annually on prevention and care. 83% of our providers are good or outstanding in Lincolnshire, better than most. Delays of discharge from hospital are well managed and relatively low. Our value for money is among the best.

£1.3bn is spent every year by the doctors for 3/4m people in Lincolnshire, much greater than spent on care. We spend large sums once people are sick, but much less, just £3bn to councils for prevention. LCC spends £150m plus £57m for covid, and provide 55,000 home care visits.

Money

The County Council employs over 4,600 people and spends around £1bn/yr and has an ambitious capital programmme, mainly on schools and roads. Increased cost due to covid is around £100m.

Unlike the police, Councils have a separate investment fund to pay for staff pensions, so they do not come out of our annual taxes. The shared pension fund for 74K members is £2.7bn. The Legal service shared between District and County Councils has 75 lawyers, paid from income raised. There are 300 democratic meetings per year!
