Alan Osborne - Boston and South Holland

As part of the Safer Together Teams activity throughout November, Alan had great success in engaging residents of Spalding in having their say in the Annual Crime and Policing Survey. You may also have seen Alan across Boston, talking to local communities and raising awareness of the survey, supporting those who wanted to have their say.

Alan has also been active in the Armed Forces Veterans Board and the Armed Forces Covenant Board, which he will continue to attend on the Safer Together Teams behalf throughout 2022.

Throughout 2021 Alan has been engaging with the Good Neighbour Scheme in Boston and the Mutual Gain project in Sutton Bridge. This work will continue on through 2022.

Maisie McMahon - North and South Kesteven

During October, Maisie represented the OPCC at the Lincolnshire Association of Local Councils - sharing with them the work of the Safer Together Team and offering opportunities to become involved in activity as representatives of their communities

As with the other Safer Together Team Coordinators, during November Maisie engaged the public in conversations about the annual Crime and Policing Survey. This included letter drops in some targeted locations where uptake on the survey had been low in previous years.

Maisie has continued to attend Parish Council meetings across North and South Kesteven, hearing about issues and concerns of local areas, linking in with local Neighbourhood Policing Teams to support communities to find solutions.

Roisin Mullee - East Lindsey

Throughout September to December, Roisin was out and about across East Lindsey talking with communities about local issues.

During November Roisin visited communities across East Lindsey to engage with residents face to face and support them in completing the annual Crime and Policing Survey, allowing more people to have their say on Policing in Lincolnshire.

Following feedback from the residents of Hosthorpe Roisin held a community drop in, supported by the Neighbourhood Policing Team and Crime Prevention Team, to talk to residents about Fraud and Community Safety.

Stephanie Marwood - West Lindsey and Lincoln

During November, Stephanie undertook letter drops in targeted locations across West Lindsey to increase the reach and uptake on the annual Crime and Policing Survey 2021. She also was out and about across West Lindsey and Lincoln with the local Neighbourhood Policing Teams and the EDDIE van, as well as attending local coffee mornings to talk to communities about what matters to them.

Stephanie has also been actively involved in the local partnership groups relating to Anti Social Behaviour, ensuring that the views gathered from the public is heard when developing solutions for local areas.
