PARISH COUNCILS - CODE OF CONDUCT WORKSHOPS

North Kesteven adopted the new Local Government Association (LGA) model code of conduct in May 2022.

The new Model Code is clearer in terms of obligations around the standards of behaviour and conduct mean and how they should be followed. Alongside the guidance gives useful examples making it more understandable to members, officers, and the public alike. Having one single code provides consistency and reflects common expectations that the public have in relation to the conduct and behaviour of elected Members.

The code and guidance along with a summary of the arrangements around adopting the code has been previously shared with parish councils at the end of May and the beginning of June. Since just over twenty parish councils in the District have now adopted the new Code and NKDC encourage the others to do so as soon as possible.

Templates of the Code and Guidance are available for councils to use as part of adopting. NK's thanks to Washingborough Parish Council for providing their template version which some councils might find more user friendly.

An online workshop event specifically for parish clerks/councillors remains on 5th September, to be delivered by the Monitoring Officer. There will be maximum numbers at each event to ensure ease of participation. NKDC do plan to offer a further date in the Autumn. These dates are Thursday 13th October at 6pm-8pm and Monday 28th November 6pm-8pm if you have not already booked for 5th September 5pm-7pm.

MAJOR A17 IMPROVEMENTS

This is an update on last month's newsletter:-

Works to reconstruct the section of A17 between Beckinham and Leadenham will start on Monday 12th September.

The total programme of works is expected to last for up to 3 1/2 months, subject to weather. There will likely be a break in the works during the Christmas period.

As part of the scheme, the A17 between Sleaford Road in Beckingham to Leadenham Low Fields, will be closed overnight from 7pm until 6am, weekday nights only.

Please note that some weekend working will be required from 7pm Friday night until 6am on the following Monday morning. The proposed weekends are 30th September to 3rd October; 7-10th October; and 14th -17th October.

The government is providing £150 million pounds over four years to support community groups in England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland to take ownership of assets and amenities at risk of being lost such as community centres, parks, pubs and post office buildings. Voluntary and community groups can bid for match funding to acquire important assets and run them for the benefit of the local community.
