# Welbourn Play Area Reborn!

Work on Welbourn Village Play Park has now started. Contractors from Proludic started the installation of the new equipment on 27th November and despite the challenging weather conditions have worked incredibly hard to progress the project. Included is a new Double Zip Wire, two Multi Play Units as well as several smaller items, all of which will help keep the children entertained for years to come. The project was arranged by Welbourn Parish Council and enabled by

£81,344 from FCC Communities Foundation, a not-for-profit business that awards grants for community projects through the Landfill Communities Fund. With a site in Leadenham and the organisation able to support projects within a 10 mile radius of a FCC Environment landfill site, many other surrounding villages could also benefit. Huge thanks to everyone involved.

### Lincoln Castle is looking good

Our County Council is responsible for Lincoln Castle. We received a coveted 'Gold Award' from Visit England – one of only four venues in the whole of the East Midlands to receive the honour this year – recognising it as one of the top visitor attractions in the country.

Earlier this year Lincoln was England's most visited free castle. For a sector that is struggling, nationally, to recover from the effects of the pandemic and an ongoing cost of living crisis, it's great to celebrate Lincoln Castle's success.

No to a tax-raising Mayor - Petition <<u>https://chng.it/Jytgt7CmN7</u>> Many of our members are very concerned about losing our District and County councillors' powers and money, pushed up into a new Mayoral Combined authority. Strategic planning, housing and transport are lifted from our District and County Councils into just a few hands of the Mayoral Combined Authority. I have been investigating and there are some serious risks in the "detail". I have written a five-minute summary here.

New Scrutiny Committees of the combined authority should be politically representative. The political make-up of Lincolnshire shows the majority of councillors being Independent (66%). Taking in North and NE Lincolnshire waters down our contribution to 27%.

The new additional layer, pushes power into very few hands and the money is no more than we get already. Money, including that from HS2 for transport should come to our councils as they are. Please share the petition and encourage others. This is a new tax-raising layer of bureaucracy. The deal sells Lincolnshire short and I believe we should not buy it. ## Supporting Sleaford Market Square

Close on 3,000 objections including two petitions were made against the Conservative-led proposal to dig up Sleaford Market Square. The Conservative Leader declared an interest in the proposal to

spend £2m digging up Sleaford Market Square, to remove high performing engineering bricks that match the tudor frames with a mix of sandstone, resin gravel and concrete raised beds. I made the case that the structures would limit the current use for big events, such as the concerts, Christmas market and Remembrance Services. It also removes parking which people said makes it a lot harder for the local businesses, Church services and prevents some people visiting and shopping. On the planning committee, we twice called for the application to be deferred for improvements. The sticking point in planning that remained was the lack of parking for disabled people on most days. With a full chamber of public looking on, the application was passed, but only just, 4:4 plus the Chairman's second casting vote.

There was a petition at the next full Council meeting from Mr Henson, a key local supporter of Sleaford, calling to halt the upheaval of the Square. On that morning, Mr Henson was interviewed by the television in the square he loved, and then sadly died, giving his heart and soul to the battle to preserve Sleaford. Hours later, the Conservatives voted not to accept the petition.

Next on the agenda, Lincolnshire Independent, Cllr David Suiter put a motion to full council not to proceed with the damaging development. The Conservative majority voted against it, apparently intent on continuing.

### Tackling Industrial Solar Developments

The huge scale of industrial developments continues to be a significant battle with unlimited applications coming in - 58,000 acres in Lincolnshire right now. There is a good speech from one of our members, Cllr Peter Overton putting a motion to call for limits on the industrial solar developments, seconded by Cllr Mitch Elliott. The motion was amended and passed unanimously. www.lincolnshireindependents.org.uk

The main issues raised so far is the size of the projects, well over 2,000 acres each and loss of country landscape that is currently growing crops, whilst other measures such as insulation and roof panels are still not in place, even on large commercial buildings. Our Parish Councils and public are doing an amazing job working through all of the issues in detail. If you would like to help, please let me know.

### Scampton and Asylum Seekers

I have lobbied hard nationally against large numbers of young asylum seekers being placed at Scampton, without adequate support services and also concerned about their safety. It also prevents local investment plans. The Government is however, going ahead. The migrants will be living in portakabins on the runway, eight to a kabin.

The RAF buildings are too degraded to convert for accommodation, but are being used for laundry etc. The Government has given an extra £2m for policing, £1m for the asylum seekers. They will also have their own nurse-led health care and transport to Lincoln. Legal bills mount up as the Government seeks to overcome local people and the District Council. First arrivals are now delayed until mid-April and the issue remains a tinder-box.

In the meantime, I have a briefing on our other refugees from Ukraine, some still comfortably with families, and from other countries who have a right to be here, but are still needing support. I am arguing for the money for Councils to provide essential services and some is in hand. but finding eight bedroom houses for large families is a challenge.
