If you want big quantities of food, then it has to be the supermarkets. There is a handy system. A lorry turns up at Sleaford Community Food Bank and two in Grantham, that I know of. At the village hall in Earlsfield in Grantham, it took about twenty volunteers to unload and sort into 36 individual food bags, ready for collection by those in need. For quantity, I am sure it outstrips anything residents provide locally. I am sure District Councillor <u>Tim Harrison</u> would be happy to advise. I appreciate you are collecting tins and the supermarket stuff is largely fresh food. In

Sleaford the food goes into the very successful Community Shop set up by the New Life Church where you can buy a range of goods from different categories for £5.
